Despite being a relatively small country, Ireland has a very rich and dynamic cultural tradition. This Seminar aims to bring that culture closer through the study of Irish literature, music, film and history. Its goal is to enhance the participants' knowledge of subjects traditionally hidden or undercovered in modules such as "Enalish Literature" or "British Culture and Civilisation". During this week, emphasis will be put on the cultural representations of so-called "otherness" as construed in Irish society, where women, homosexuals, migrants, travellers and other minority groups have been traditionally marginalised. To address this issue, several scholars will attend the event along with award-winning writers Donal Ryan and Emilie Pine. Additionally, we will count on the participation of the Irish music band Gan Ainm, and Ceili Dance workshop.

#### **Evaluation**

Attendance: In order to get an attendance certificate, students must attend 90% of the sessions. Absence to more sessions must be duly justified.

Presentation of final report: In addition, students must prepare a brief summary that must be delivered within 15 days after the end of the Seminar.
